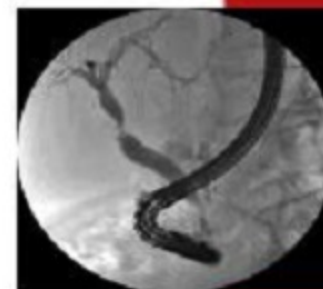

**TRAIN:** The nearest stations to the Jubilee Conference Centre is Nottingham Train station which is 2 miles away. There are over 30 direct trains that travel between St Pancras and Nottingham on a daily basis.

**CAR:** Leave the M1 at Junction 25 taking the A52 to Nottingham. After five miles you will come to the A6514 (Middleton Boulevard) roundabout. Go straight across (this becomes Derby Road). On your right you will pass the Queen's Medical Centre. About 1 mile past the roundabout turn left onto Triumph Road (Jaguar Garage is on the corner). The Jubilee Conference Centre is situated on the left after half a mile. Proceed through the security barrier, at the end of the road turn left; the Jubilee Conference Centre main entrance is situated on the right.

**PARKING:** There is car parking available on-site at the Jubilee Conference Centre, it is on a 'first come first served basis'. Visitors to the Conference Centre do not need to pay for parking. Once you have parked your car, please go to the reception and pick up a 'Parking Permit'.

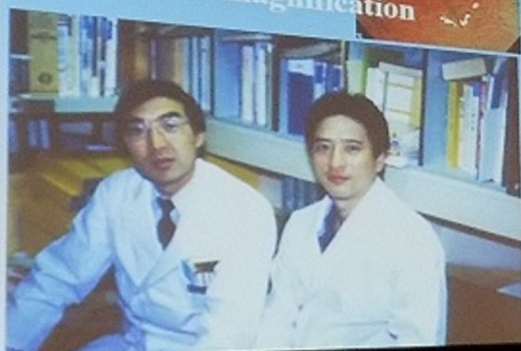


First zoom colonoscope

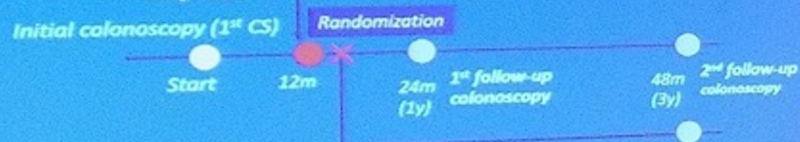


Confirmation colonoscopy (2<sup>nd</sup> CS)
